<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Applied three years of college research knowledge and tools to develop an independent two-semester study;</li><li>• Constructed APA-formatted annotated bibliography of over 40 empirical and review articles on moral intuition, life-history strategy, religion and politics;</li><li>• Developed a moderated mediation hypothesis exploring the relationship between life-history strategy and moral intuition, with religiosity and political ideology as potential mediators;</li><li>• Combined and developed new scales to measure people’s life-history strategy, the strength of moral intuitions, political ideology, religiosity and demographics; participants will be recruited via both Hamilton participant pool and Amazon Mechanical Turk;</li><li>• Correlational analysis will be performed through SPSS and significant results and discussions were presented at <i>Hamilton-sponsored Senior Project Conference</i>;</li><li>• A 40+ page APA-style manuscript were produced to defend my senior project</li></ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Led 2 team members to review and summarize over 30 academic studies on the relationship between moral character and blame attribution toward sexual assault, identified current limitations in research of moral character and perpetrator blame</li><li>• Created a 3 (perpetrator character: positive vs. negative vs. neutral) x 3 (victim character: positive vs. negative vs. neutral) between-subjects experimental design and developed target vignettes that manipulated perpetrator and victim’s characteristics;</li><li>• Prepared study materials such as a questionnaire assessing participants’ blame ratings and emotions through Qualtrics, evaluated reliability of the measure and formulated procedures for running the experiments (i.e., consent forms, assessment forms, presentation of stimuli and other materials, follow-up questions, debriefing page);</li><li>• Recruited 351 participants via Amazon’s Mechanical Turk and performed a between-subjects ANOVA analysis of main effect for moral character and blame and an independent samples t-test exploratory analysis for mood and emotion through SPSS</li><li>• Designed a report poster summarizing all the significant findings, displayed the poster and presented our project at the <i>Hamilton College Summer Collaborative Research Program Poster Session</i>, the <i>New York Six Undergraduate Research Conference</i> and the <i>2023 SPSP Annual Convention</i></li></ul>
